

Access to Flying

For Experienced Pilots

Whether you have a Private Pilot Certificate and want to fly for fun, or if you want to seek advanced ratings, Syracuse Flying Club can provide you with low cost access to well-maintained aircraft.

Advantages of a flying club:

- ◆ Lower cost than personally owned
- ◆ The aircraft may be taken on trips that are overnight or a few days
- ◆ Club insurance covers members' needs. All members are covered for both liability and hull damage on Club aircraft under most circumstances (there is a deductible on the hull coverage)

Those with Private Pilot or higher certificates pay:

- ◆ Non-refundable initiation fee of \$500, which entitles the member to the use of the Club aircraft.
- ◆ Ground time is \$75 per month
- ◆ The per-hour charge for the aircraft (see Flying Rates section)
- ◆ A per-hour fee to your instructor, for check-outs or advanced instruction

Access to Flight Instruction

For Student Pilots

No experience is required for student pilots! Learning to fly with the Syracuse Flying Club provides you with the opportunity to train with FAA certified flight instructors in reasonably priced, well-maintained aircraft. Instructors are available from the Club's list of Associate Member Instructors.

By learning to fly in "Class C" airspace at Hancock Airport, students become comfortable working with air traffic control and a control tower in a radar environment with a variety of air traffic... good preparation for flying in any situation, at any airport.

Costs for student pilots are among the lowest in the area. You will pay:

- ◆ A non-refundable initiation fee of \$250, entitling you to train in our Piper Warrior. (Additional fee of \$250 is due after earning your Private Pilot Certificate in order to continue your membership)
- ◆ A ground time fee of \$75 per month
- ◆ A per-hour charge for the aircraft (see Flying Rates section)
- ◆ A per-hour instruction fee negotiated with and paid directly to your instructor

The Piper Archer is a 180HP four seat, well maintained IFR equipped fixed gear aircraft. Avionics include a Garmin 430W IFR GPS/NAV/COM, King KX170B NAV/COM radio with glide slope and DME and a Century IIB autopilot. It is a great platform for primary and advanced training or just to build time.

1977 Cessna 182Q Skylane

The Cessna 182 is a 230HP high-performance aircraft capable of carrying four adults and their bags at 140 knots in a luxurious leather interior. Avionics include a Garmin 430 IFR GPS, a King KX155 NAV/COM radio with glide slope, Garmin GTX330 Transponder and an STec 60-2 autopilot with altitude hold. This is the only high-performance aircraft available for club membership in the Syracuse area.
